#### **DIGITAL MODES:**

On Monday January 2<sup>nd</sup> we held the Summerland Amateur Radio Club's digital net. Starters were,VK2EA, DLR, AGC, TRD, and VK2 SRC-PMG Net Control. This week's mode was Thor 16 on FL Digi on 80 metres 3.625 USB. Conditions were pretty horrendous with noise at +10db locally, probably the worst continuous noise level I have heard, with static crashes going higher. The series of storms that passed through didn't help. EA Leith went to bed and the rest of us tried Thor 16. Decode from around the local area was still OK but Eric VL2TRD from Mt Isa had only one good over at 100% decode and the next one was only about30%. Eric TRD had some local noise which contributed to the propagation conditions deteriorating rapidly.We retired to 70cm after Geoff AGC said that Eric had popped up on IRLP on Mt Nardi. It was good to have a voice contact with Eric. The IRLP link between ARD's tower and the clubrooms dropped out for some reason and Eric TRD disappeared. The net ended with AGC, DLR and PMG trying both 70cm frequencies. All three of us were good on Mt Nardi but DLR was very scratchy on Parrots Nest, not surprising considering the amount of hilly real estate in the way.

A good net considering the weather.
