Monday 25 June 2018

For tonight’s net we had VK2PMG/SRC as net control with John VK2JWA, Leith VK2EA, Steve VK2SLM, Kris VKL2KWW, Dave VK2ZDR, Chris VK2ACD and Duncan VK2DLR. After the customary round of greeting and chat we QSY’d to 2 metres USB, 145.1 MHz. Chris, Duncan and I were ready to transmit.

Tonight we used the analogue image transmission program MMSSTV again using PD120 and 240. Signal strengths ranged from S7 (Chris) to less than S1 (Duncan). In spite of the low signal strength from Duncan, the images he transmitted were fine. SSB showing its advantages again.

Kris VK2KWW tried to participate but VK2SRC couldn’t hear him. An experiment a few days later on 80, 40 and 6 metres SSB between Kris and I had no more success. The path between us just had too many hills in the way and neither of us could hear each other. A very nice net finished at 10.10pm. Thanks to all those who logged in and participated
