DIGI-NET REPORT:

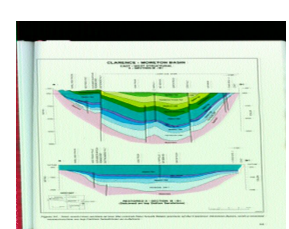
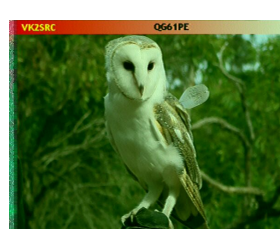
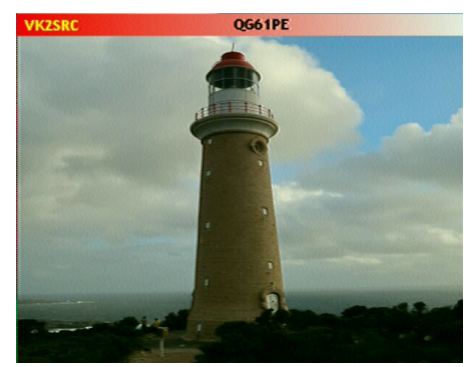
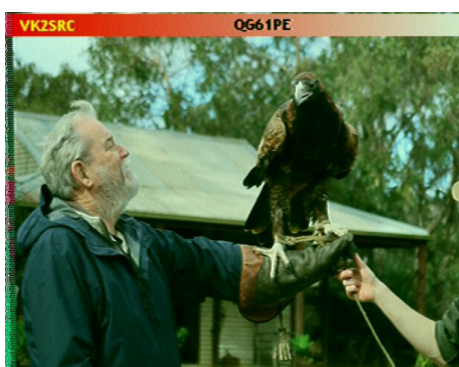
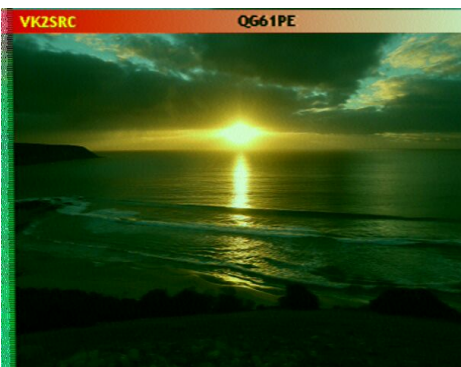
Monday 3rd July 2018

After an initial round of greetings, Chris, Duncan and I QSY'd to our frequency of 145.1 USB. Chris started things off but I had no image while Duncan did. A computer restart fixed things. Duncan wanted to test the clarity of the text and prepared a page of text. He used PD290 and the signal strength was S4, the text was perfectly readable even though the smallest lines of text were only 10 point size. The other images were mostly landscapes and wildlife and all came through fine. Signal strengths dropped later on but that did not affect the quality. The various sizes of PD were used for their larger image sizes.

A very nice net finished at 10.15pm. Thanks to all those who logged in and participated.
