Mt. Nardi 70cm repeater VK2RPL and Byron Bay 2m repeater VK2RBB have been temporarily linked via the clubrooms.

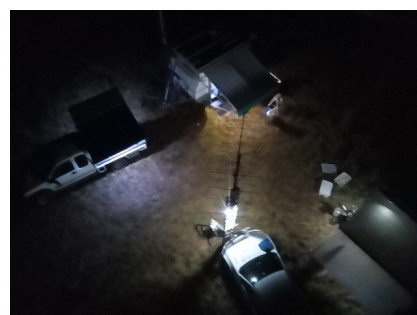

Successful VHF/UHF Winter Field Day:

Pat VK2FAAD, Dave VK2CDG & Graeme VK2QJ activated the Club callsign for the Winter VHF/UHF Field Day, as **VK2SRC** portable. The location was the Clouds Creek fire tower at 726m , grid locator QF69IW and this turned out to be a good spot as an alternative to the preferred location of Vista Point.

The weather was fine and they worked 6m, 2m, 70cm and 23cm, amassing a score reportedly over 50,000. This was helped by several club members taking part as home stations.

TUESDAY 23 JUNE, 2020

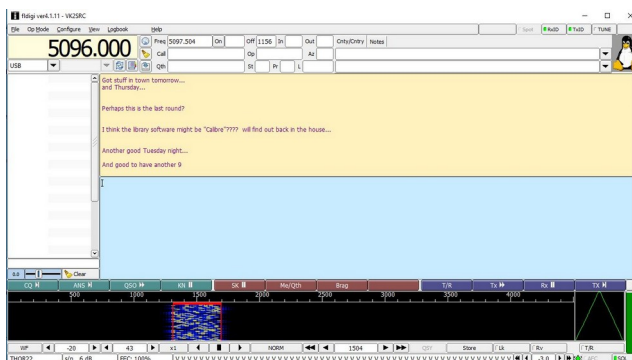
Well, for this week we had quite a good rollup logging in. Joining *Paul VK2PMG* as *VK2SRC* were *Leith VK2EA*, *John VK2JWA*, *Dave VK2ZDR*, *Duncan VK2DLR*, *Pat VK2FAAD* and *Malcolm VK2OTA*. As per usual we had our normal two rounds of personal chat. It was very pleasing to have Malcolm log in.

Dave, Duncan and I then QSY'd to our usual frequency of 144.230 USB, using Fl Digi and Thor 22. I did the usual tune on the 1500 Hz offset to aid in fine tuning. Both Dave and Duncan were about 144.229.84 or so compared to my 144.230. The fine tuning results in a more natural sounding voice. Thor 22 is pretty forgiving as well as being great in noise, so VHF USB was a breeze and no problems were encountered. Signal strengths were about S7-S8 or so.

Fl Digi is a pretty easy program to use, once the computer and radio "talk" to each other correctly. It also allows for a nice conversational flow where ideas can be exchanged. A very enjoyable net, it was pleasing so see everyone's rig working perfectly. Thanks to Dave and Duncan for their support and to all who logged in to support the net.
