## Tuesday-Net Report

### **DIGITAL MODES**

#### - Paul VK2AMT

Sat 16<sup>th</sup> JUL


#### TUESDAY 21 JUNE, 2022

For this evening's net, joining Paul VK2AMT as VK2SRC were John VK2ZJJ, Duncan VK2DLR, Jeff VK2WSR and Dave VK2ZDR logging in. As it happened, all bar John VK2ZJJ were ready to proceed with digital and we all QSY'd to 80 metres.

We used Fldigi and Olivia 8-500 on our normal frequency of 3.590 USB. There were some light static crashes heard from offshore weather down south. The noise at my location was S4. Most of us used about 40 watts, Dave used 20 watts. All the signals received were around S9 or comfortably above. A good aspect of our frequency is the relative absence of interfering signals, unlike 40 metres which is quite busy in the digital modes area.

The decoding accuracy was 100% and we all enjoyed the benefits of 80 metres' local propagation benefits without the noise from weather systems that may well intrude later in the year. An excellent net with good discussion. Thanks to all who participated.




## 6-DAY LISMORE (FORECAST). Click image to open METEYE (2480 for East Lismore).
