- Paul VK2AMT

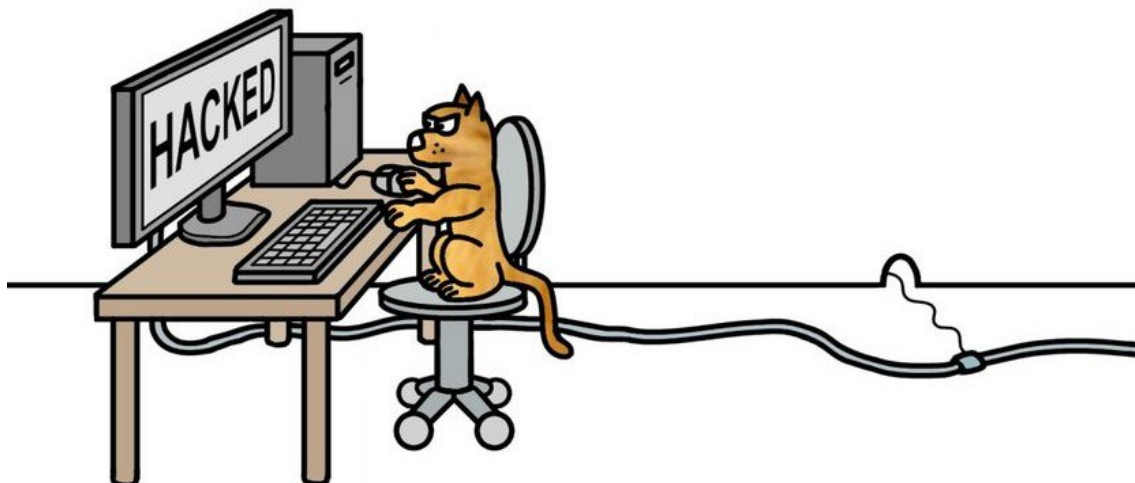
TUESDAY 18 OCTOBER, 2022

This evening, Paul VK2AMT as VK2SRC, was joined by: Duncan VK2DLR, John [VK2ZJJ](#), Jeff VK2WSR and Dave VK2ZDR. We had a couple of normal rounds of chatter on Woodburn 2 metres. I had planned to go to 40 metres, 7.040 USB but John advised us that 7.035 USB was quieter, so that's where we went.

As usual, we used Olivia 8-500 on Fldigi. The signal-to-noise readings were: Duncan -5-6, Jeff and Dave +1-2 but they did vary with the fading. Olivia handled it all quite easily. We will continue to use 40 metres, it seems to work well both locally and for more distant contacts. The noise may be lower than 80 metres during storm season and there is more traffic on 40 metres anyway. Discussion on the net included yagi making progress, with Jeff making the element standoffs with a 3D printer.

Just as Jeff and Dave were thinking of heading off, we had a visit from Scott, VK1PWE in Canberra. Scott has been on the Digi Net before, but it was a while ago. It was good to see him back again for a couple of overs. Visitors are always welcome on the Digi Net, it's not just for club members. Another good session. Thanks to all who login and participated.
