Over the weekend of 26-27 November, 5 keen prospective hams attended a Foundation Licence course at the clubrooms and sat for the exams.

The teachers were Duncan VK2DLR and Jeff VK2WSR, with Chris VK2ACD doing the administrative work and Paul VK2AMT operating the 'remote station' for the practical assessments. This was the culmination of months of work by the same group, who have been meeting every Wednesday via Zoom, to produce a set of on-line learning modules, for candidates to study prior to the 2 day course.

It has been a great team effort. Previously, Duncan had shouldered most of the load, but with Jeff coming in with a teaching background, this has been eased. Also, with Chris taking on the administrative side, the teachers have been able to focus on what they do best, and not have to deal with organising enrolments and getting the AMC paperwork done. Jeff also got the ball rolling with the module construction and we had the benefit of Paul's experience to produce our own graphics.


