Digi-Net Report:


TUESDAY 22 NOVEMBER. 2022


Tonight, Paul VK2AMT as VK2SRC was joined by Duncan VK2DLR, John VK2ZJJ and Jeff VK2WSR. As usual we had a couple of rounds of personal news and chatter on Woodburn 2 metres before Duncan and Jeff and I QSY'd to our normal frequency of 7.035 USB.

We used Fldigi and Olivia 8-500 to start with. Jeff had expressed a desire to experiment with CW mode, so after a couple of rounds of Olivia we switched to CW. The mode os displayed in capital letters, like RTTY. The results were variable, my own signals didn't decode very well but Duncan and Jeff's messages were decoded somewhat better. From my location, the CW decoding accuracy wasn't much better than 70%.

We all agreed that although it was fun to have a go at CW mode, it was nowhere as robust and reliable as Olivia – still the best keyboard mode and we switched back to it for the rest of the net. Most of the conversation centered around the forthcoming Foundation tests and SARC Ed matters. Thanks to Duncan and Jeff for being there and helping to keep the Digi Net alive.
