The Woodburn repeater is off the air until at least Thursday 19th. A new standby battery is to be fitted, and the cavities are being re-tuned. Also some other minor repairs to be done and removal of frogs from the equipment cabinet.

LISMORE 2 metre REPEATER OUT OF SERVICE

Due to problems with the receive antenna, the repeater on 146.8 MHz will be out of service until further notice. We are awaiting the arrival of a new stacked folded dipole antenna and hardline cabling. In the meantime use either the 70cm repeater, or the Woodburn repeater on 147.250 MHz.


