


#### Tuesday-Net Report

Duncan, Jeff and Dave all joined me on 7.048 USB using Fldigi's Olivia 8-500. It was very good that Jeff continues to log in remotely during his trip to South Australia. This was a fitting reward for all the hard and continuing work put in by Ross VK2ARD to install and maintain the remote control software which enables our operators to use the club's radio gear from well outside the local area. The fact is that this additional layer of remote control and internet connections doesn't stop digital modes from working. This still amazes me. Signals here were still weaker than the rest of the group, Dave's

was particularly low but that didn't affect decoding accuracy. The noise on 40 metres at my location on the Yaesu FT-897 was still S9.





