
DIGITAL MODES

This week, logging in with Paul VK2AMT as VK2SRC was Phil VK2YGF, who detailed the change in his address after his house was swamped by the flood of two years ago, taking all his radio gear with it. It was good to hear of his new radio, a Yaesu FT-710. A very nice modern rig. There were no other takers logging in and Phil wasn't set up for digital modes yet, so I QSY'd to our HF frequency.

A rotten wooden pole had come down, taking the OCF dipole with it. That necessitated a move to 40 metres and the Hustler trapped vertical, the 4BTV. The frequency was 7.050 USB, in the middle of the digital part of 40m in the Band Plan. The frequency had more random digital signals nearby than 80 metres but our ever reliable Olivia 8-500 mode simply ignored them all. It really is a most resilient keyboard mode. I had told Jeff about the change and he was waiting for me there. Signals were very good, noise S4 and Jeff was comfortably above that and the signal-noise ratio varied from +6 to +8. The waterfall signal was quite strong.



Dave VK2ZDR dropped in at 9.10pm. He was very welcome. It is much better to have an operator arrive late than not at all!! Some of the discussion involved Jeff's experiments with a wide field all-sky camera, which was already producing good results with the promise of better images to come. It was another good net with interesting discussion. The move to 40m may be with us for a while until the wire antenna is strung up again. It was good to hear Phil logging in and thanks to Jeff and Dave for their support.









WABAC MACHINE
