

The little antenna did a fine job. Dave VK2ZDR joined us at some point. I was using the new 80 / 40m dipole antenna this week. Phil only did a few short overs and then decoded us. Shane VK2HAZ was also a "decoder". Signals were pretty good, no one had any decoding problems.


Hello Peter.






## 6-DAY LISMORE (FORECAST). Click image to open METEYE (2480 for East Lismore).




