


Tuesday Net Report

This week, joining Paul VK2AMT as VK2SRC were: Duncan VK2DLR and Jo VK2ZJJ. We had our normal couple of rounds of chat on 2 metres Parrots Nest before Duncan and I QSY'd to 40 metres, 7.045 USB to avoid some voice traffic on 7.050. We used Fldigi and Olivia 8-500, as usual.



Jeff VK2NU and Dave VK2ZDR were waiting for us. Shane VK2HAZ was around, decoding us via a SDR. Noise was only S3 but it sounded louder than that. Dave's signal was just above S3 and his S/N was about -10 to me. Olivia starts to lose decode much lower than -10, especially if there is some QSB. Jeff was S5 and +2 to +8 and Duncan was S6 and +9. Jeff had a session on FT8 on 10 metres and was hammered by Japanese and Indonesians. Ross VK2ARD and Rob VK2ARL were both on FT8 also. Really good to see. The conditions really deteriorated around 9pm and everyone lost most of Jeff's signal suddenly.

It was good to have four of us on the net. Duncan's signal held up very well, easily the strongest. The net finished off by 9.15, most of us were ready for an early mark. Thanks to all who participated.


This is a picture of an asteroid crater in Arizona...




